Student Services Update

As District 31 prepared to reopen schools amid the Coronavirus pandemic, we ensured students with disabilities, 504 plans, and multilingual learners were fully integrated into every aspect of reopening plans. It is essential to ensure the needs of all students are addressed and decisions benefit all students, staff, and families.

A number of items were identified as overarching areas of concern and were addressed in reopening planning. These areas include health and safety personal protective equipment (PPE) such as masks, instructional programs, and communication. McKinney- Vento Services

Those who lack a fixed, regular, and adequate nighttime residence or share the housing of oth-









er persons due to loss of housing or economic hardship are eligible for McKinney-Vento services. Services include the right to stay in the school the student was last enrolled or immediately enroll in school without documents normally required, receive free school meals and fee waivers for school fees, transporta-


