English Learner Program

The English Learner (EL) Program is proudly serving nearly 200 students predominantly in the languages of Mongolian, Russian, Korean, and Spanish. Weekly COVID-19 Testing

District 31 was proud to partner with SHIELD Illinois to be one of the first elementary districts in the area to offer weekly COVID-19 testing for all Winkelman and Field students and staff. Offering the testing program allows students (with no symptoms) who are identified at school as a close contact to a COVID postive student to "test to stay" in school. Students not participating in the test to stay program who are identified as a close contact must quarantine at home for 10 days. The weekly COVID-19 testing and test to stay have been incredibly successful mitigation tools that have allowed students and staff to return to a more normal learning environment, while keeping students safe and healthy.
